I have to admit that I am really excited about the Weeks Reunion being held in the Harrisburg Area this year. I have put a number of lists together. I will share parts of them in this newsletter and others will be handouts at registration along with the materials that will be provided by the Military Reunion Planners.

After the welcome reception Wednesday evening, I will share some historical tidbits on the area. I will also provide information to make your touring in the area a bit easier for those that plan to do some touring on their own. You will discover that the area has many things of interest that are easy to travel to by car. History buffs will have a hard time seeing all the area offers. In addition to my **brief** talk on Wednesday, I will provide copies of my notes and will make myself available in the hospitality room for those that want to hear more.

In breaking with recent tradition on entertainment, we will have a three piece combo provide entertainment for us Saturday after the banquet. Jay and the Jingos are quite popular in the Tri-City area and I had to book them early. They play before veterans groups on a regular basis and the leader, Jay, is quite the trumpeter. I heard them at a Shrine Legion of Honor party and enjoyed them immensely. They will entertain, do tributes and dance music including line dance music. I know you will enjoy them.

As noted elsewhere in this newsletter, Commander Randolph Patterson passed away in March. He served as Captain of the Weeks from 1965 to 1966. In addition to including the Commander in our Memorial Service, we will set time aside to share stories, memories and eulogies for all those who wish to attend and participate. It is possible that Randy's daughters will be attending our reunion. We thank Ray Goodmuth for tracking down his obituary and making contact with the family.

At registration, I will have a listing of most of the eating establishments in the Harrisburg-Hershey-Lancaster-York area. It is from a readers survey so there is some guidance on the type of food as well as favorites in each category.

Just out the back door of the hotel, there is a shopping center with eight eating places. In addition, there are another four restaurants within a five minute or less drive from the hotel. Both groups are listed below. It is my understanding that if the hotel airport shuttle is not in use, they will shuttle patrons within short distances but it will be somewhat erratic for obvious reasons. As you can see by the tour listing, we have full day tours for Gettysburg and Hershey. I want to make you aware that the following sites in Hershey will be very close to Chocolate World: Antique Auto Club Museum, the Hershey Outlets (60 stores and no tax on clothing), Troegs Brewery and Brew Pub (top 50 in U.S.), and the Derry Township Historical Society where Major Dick Winters (Band of Brothers) donated his memorabilia and office.

One tour that I thought would be very worthwhile was a tour of the Pennsylvania Capitol Building. Unfortunately, while there is no cost for the tour, the bus transportation cost made it cost unworthy. Here is a short write-up I did on it and I encourage you to fit it in if you can. Did she help make them great? Or was she great because of them?"

John B DeSilvey - I received a call from John's son Dennis DeSilvey, Col Ret USAR. He wanted us to know that his father passed away in 1985. John was one of the original Weeks crew members, he reported aboard in 1944 as a F1c.

Charles C Lewis "Duck" - The family of Charles reported that he passed away March 29, 2009. He served aboard the Weeks in 1944 as a Sonarman. John was one of the original crew when the ship was commissioned in 1944.

Theodore C. Lockhart, Rear Admiral, USN (Ret.) - Passed away on July 24, 2013. Admiral Lockhart graduated from Officer Candidate's School in 1962 and based on the best information we have, he was then stationed aboard the USS John W Weeks where he served as a division officer and department head. His distinguished career included serving as Commander of the Surface Warfare Officers School Command in Newport and Coronado among many other ships and duty stations.

Randolph F. Patterson (CDR, USN, Ret.) - Passed away on March 2, 2014. He was 88 years old. Randy was a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy and was the respected and beloved Captain of the USS John W Weeks from 1965 to 1966. Captain Patterson dedicated over 21 years of service to his Navy and country. All who knew him would acknowledge his love of the Navy, his family and fly fishing. Edward Torgen (CDR) - Passed away after a short illness on February 21, 2014. He graduated from Brown University, class of 1950 and Boston University Law School, class of 1958. A retired Navy Commander, he served in both World War II and the Korean War, serving from 1945-1970, and for fourteen months on the destroyer USS John W Weeks. A member of the Rhode Island Bar Association for 56 years. Ed was a member of the USS John W Weeks Association. He attended many of our reunions over the years; he will be missed by his shipmates.

WWII Sea Stories - By Morris Gillett

Editor's note: Morris served on the Weeks during WWII. Over the year's he wrote several stories that are on our website Stories from our members page.

Some years back three World War II stories that I sent the Association were published on the John W. Week's website. They are still there in "Stories from Our Members". Later, these stories became part of a little book I wrote about my experiences in the wartime Navy. Prior to going to the Pacific I had served in the Atlantic. In the Pacific the war was primarily an air war. In the Atlantic it was, to a great extent, a war against the German submarines. MY WAR starts when a seventeen year old country boy leaves home to go to war. The war adventures, Pacific and Atlantic, end four years later when a wiser young man leaves the Navy and returns home.

The little autobiographical book has enjoyed reasonable popularity and is now in its second edition. For those who might be interested, it is available as MY WAR by Morris Gillett as a Kindle book on Amazon or as a paperback, printed copy on eBay.

Thursday, September 18

Historic Gettysburg is your destination. We will begin our visit at the Visitor's Center featuring the film, *A New Birth of Freedom* (sponsored by The History Channel) and narrated by Morgan Freeman; the massive Cyclorama painting, which literally surrounds visitors with a visual of the fury of Pickett's Charge brought to life with lights and sound presentation; and the Gettysburg Museum of the American Civil War, showcasing twelve exhibit galleries that contain artifacts and interactive displays. After having lunch, on your own, at either the Visitor's Center café or any number of local restaurants, we will begin our two hour guided driving tour of the battlefield.
