BLUE WATER NAVY ACT

Board Member Bob Michaels reports that the Blue Water Navy Act was signed into law on June 26. Sailors who served on a Blue Water Navy vessel offshore of the Republic of Vietnam or on another U.S. Navy or Coast Guard ship operating in the coastal waterways of Vietnam between January 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975 are eligible under this act for illnesses believed to be caused by Agent Orange. The VA will begin deciding Agent Orange exposure claims of Blue Water Navy veterans on January 1, 2020. The VA has put the number of potential recipients between 90,000 and 560,000. Hey You Seafaring Salts!

Phil Varner here! Nice people and old friends will be looking for you at Charleston at the USS John W Weeks Reunion. Don't disappoint them or yourself. Pack your ditty bag and show up. Don't forget to bring your better half. You don't want to miss a great opportunity to prove to her that some sailors were really referred to as Chief, others as Boats and some as Snipes.

There are all types of things to see and do and so many ways to enjoy Charleston. There are air and helicopter tours, walking tours and horse and buggy tours. Want adventure? Try a hot air balloon or sailing tour. Being an ole seafaring man, you may be looking for a tour of craft brew pubs. It may not be a tour but it's just a short walk to the Craft Conundrum, a five star brew pub. It's located in the parking lot next to the hotel. No food service but a fleet of food trucks arrive in the parking lot on Friday nights. Pretty servers on roller skates? Doubtful.

On Thursday, October 17, you can start the day with a privately guided and narrated bus tour of historic Civil War Charleston. Then, to the Warren Lasch Conservation Center to see the Confederate Submarine H.L. Hunley. On February 17, 1864, the Hunley sank a Union warship in the harbor. The Hunley never surfaced after sinking that ship. She remained on the bottom with her crew until August 8, 2000. The Hunley is an ongoing research project. Interesting history here as well as others throughout the city.

Two restaurants worth noting that are close to the hotel. The Tattooed Moose is a sport's type bar. The duck sandwiches are great as are the fries. The Swig & Swine is a BBQ place, not fancy food but good food.

Of those who responded to my "heads up questions," nearly everyone wanted to visit Patriots Point. I had the tour company try various combinations with the Patriots Point tour. Unfortunately, based on your responses, we weren't going to meet the minimum requirements to fill a second bus. Consequently, this increased the initially planned tours to \$99 and \$109 per person which I thought was a bit costly. So instead of being part of a tour, you can visit Fort Sumter and Fort Moultrie/Boone Hall Plantation on your free time at a lesser cost.

Friday, October 18 is the Patriots Point guided tour of the USS Yorktown CV-10 and the destroyer USS Laffey DD-724. The Laffey is the only Allen M. Sumner Class Museum Destroyer. Lunch aboard the Aircraft Carrier Yorktown CPO Mess is included as part of this tour. There is also an exhibit area called the Vietnam Experience to visit at Patriots Point. After lunch, the tour moves to Old City Market. Here we will have a couple hours of free time. We will then reboard the bus for a guided tour of the Citadel campus and finish the day watching the Citadel Dress Parade.
