TOUR BACKGROUND

HEINZ HISTORY AND SPORTS MUSEUM THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2017

The Senator John Heinz History Center, an affiliate of the Smithsonian Institution is the largest history museum in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Named after U.S. Senator H. John Heinz III (1938–1991) who is from Pennsylvania. It is located in the Strip District of Pittsburgh.

The Heinz History Center is a 275,000-square-foot educational institution "that engages and inspires a diverse audience with links to the past, understanding in the present, and guidance for the future by preserving regional history and presenting the American experience with a Western Pennsylvania connection."

The History Center features the Western Pennsylvania Sports Museum and the Library and Archives, and includes six floors of permanent and changing exhibitions that tell the story of Western Pennsylvania. Though it was originally established in 1879 the Historical Society of Western Pennsylvania opened its current location in the historic Strip District along the Allegheny River in 1996. It is named for H. John Heinz III, the late US Senator from Pennsylvania who died in a 1991 plane crash.

The century-old Chautauqua Lake Ice Company building was renovated and adapted for use as the museum. The interior was designed to show off the building's features, as well as create spaces for exhibits and support space. The museum building is an exhibit in its own right. The tour will bring to light facts you may not be aware of about the 250 years of Pittsburgh's Connection with American History starting with the French and Indian War and the importance of the steel industry and of course Mr. Roger's Neighborhood. This is just a few of the things housed In the Heinz History Center. The Center is at one end of "The Strip", an area known for Shopping and eating authentic Pittsburgh food. An exciting place for Lunch or dinner. Restaurants range from inexpensive to upscale fine Dinning. Street vendors are also scattered among the regular stores. Don't fret about staying to long as the hotel shuttle will come to your aid or try free transportation... hop on the bus or subway and ride back to the hotel for free using your Medicare Card.

Following the tour you may choose to return the hotel on the shuttle or continue to experience "THE STRIP" for shopping and a meal. Remember the last shuttle to the hotel leaves The Strip at 12:45 PM.

GATEWAY CLIPPER RIVERBOAT CRUISE FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 2017

The Gateway Clipper Fleet, founded by John E. Connelly, is a Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania based fleet of riverboats. The fleet cruises the three rivers of Pittsburgh, the Monongahela, Allegheny, and Ohio. The fleet is named after the city of Pittsburgh, which in earlier times was known as the "Gateway to the West". The original riverboat was Gateway Clipper, which set sail in 1958. By the mid-1960s, the fleet was composed of three craft, Gateway Clipper, Party Liner, and Good Ship Lollipop. In 1999 it added its fifth ship. In 2008 the Gateway Clipper Fleet celebrated its 50th year of sailing on the Three Rivers. In 2013, the fleet added its sixth ship, the all-steel classic paddle wheel Three Rivers Queen. Friday at 11:00 AM we will board the Gateway Clipper (Big Paddle Wheel River Boat). The Gateway fleet is docked just steps away from our hotel. Lunch will be served on board the Clipper and the sightseeing cruise of Pittsburgh will begin. There will be entertainment during the cruise, a "Tribute to Neil Diamond" by Chris Denim, featuring Diamond's early songs. Also drinks and specialty cocktails will be available for purchase. Before the boat returns to Station Square it will dock at the Rivers Casino. Anyone wishing to try their luck at the casino may depart and do so. From there it will return to Station Square and hotel at approximately 2:30 PM. People who depart at the casino will need to provide their own transportation back to the hotel. Cab fare is about \$15.00 the hotel shuttle is free and transports folks to/from the casino.
